Application for Power Plant in the Fort McKay area

Total E&P Canada Ltd. (Total) filed a facility application to construct and operate two 85-megawatt co-generation power plants in the Fort McKay area.

Anyone who wishes to express objections to, concerns about, or support for the application, must make a written submission to the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) on or before **May 28, 2014** clearly identifying **Proceeding ID No. 259** on the submission.

Information about the application:

Total E&P Canada Ltd. Facility Application No. 1560592

In accordance with Section 11 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, Total E&P Canada Ltd. (formerly Total E&P Joslyn Ltd.) filed an application with the AUC on February 12, 2008 requesting approval to construct and operate a power plant to support operation of the planned Total Joslyn North Mine Project. Total later asked the AUC to suspend consideration of its application pending other regulatory approvals. In November 2013 and February 2014, Total filed updates to its application and asked the AUC to continue with its processing of the application. The power plant as applied for would contain two 85-megawatt cogeneration units to be located within the Total Joslyn North Mine Project. The mine project is not part of the power plant application.

Please be aware that any information and materials you provide as part of an AUC proceeding, except information granted confidentiality, will become part of the public record and will be posted to the AUC's electronic filing system. This includes personal information, such as your name, address and any other personal information you provide.

AUC decision-making process:

The AUC is reviewing the application and will advise when it has been deemed complete, and will review submissions received. Those who have made submissions, who have been determined by the Commission to have rights that may be directly and adversely affected by a decision on this application, will be considered to have standing. If no submissions are received, or if submissions are received from persons without standing, the AUC may make a decision on the application without further notice or without a public hearing. Alternatively, the Commission will hold a public hearing if it receives an objection from a person with standing and further details will be provided in a notice of hearing.
