Applications for a time extension to construct the Peace Butte Wind Power Project in the Seven Persons area have been received

Proceeding 21779 Applications 21779-A001 and 21779-A002

The Alberta Utilities Commission, the independent utilities regulator, will be considering the electric transmission development applications in Proceeding 21779. If you feel you may be affected by these applications you can provide input to the AUC to review before it makes its decision.

Pteragen Canada Inc. has applied for a time extension to complete the construction of the Peace Butte Wind Power Project. The project consists of 60, two-megawatt wind power turbines, a substation designated as Tothill 219S Substation, and a 34.5-kilovolt collector system consisting of underground and overhead power lines. The project is located near the village of Seven Persons in Cypress County, approximately 22 kilometres south of Medicine Hat. Pteragen Canada Inc. is seeking an extension to complete the construction from December 31, 2016 to December 31, 2018. The turbine locations are listed below and are shown in the attached map.

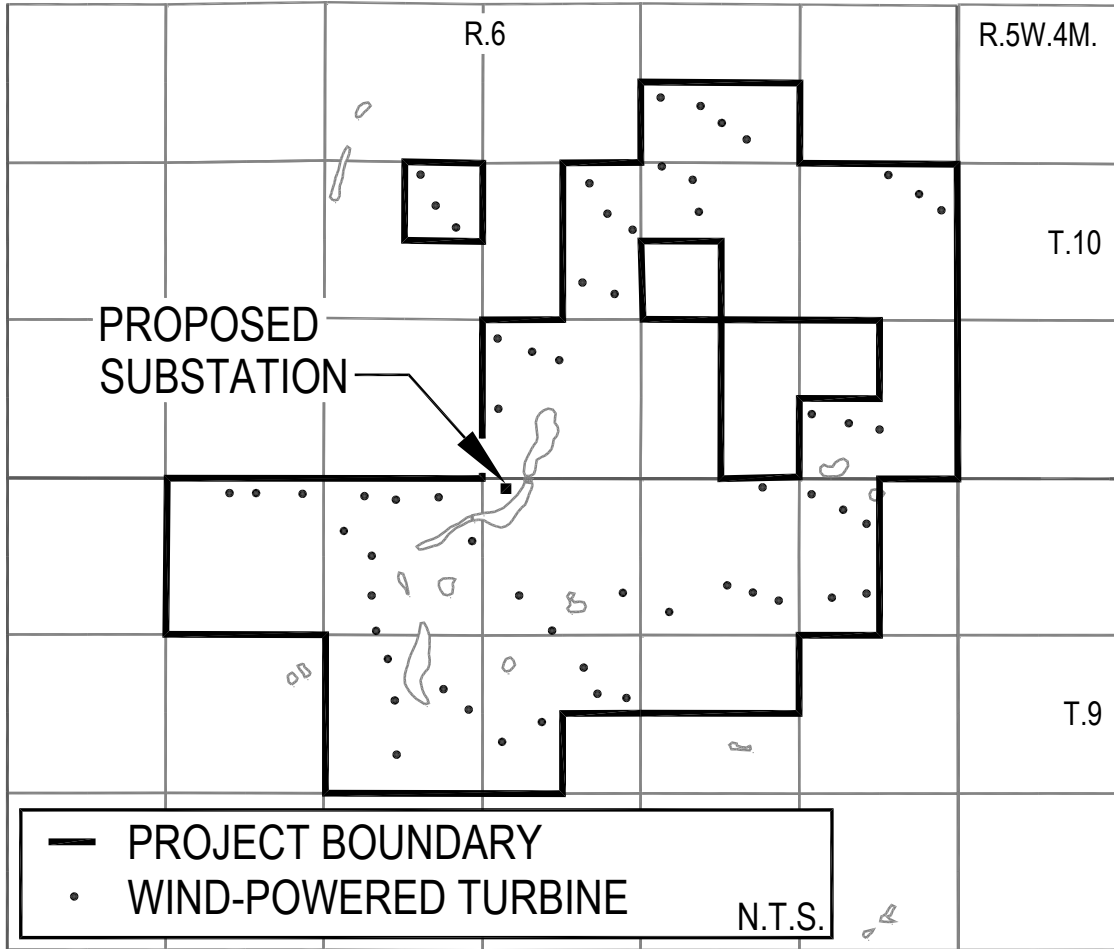
