


Dear Senator Eckardt:

Pursuant to Md. Public Utilities Article §§ 7-207(c)(1)(iv)-(v), Egypt Road Solar, LLC (the “Applicant”) hereby provides notice that on December 20, 2016 it filed an Application with the Maryland Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a 45.90 MW Solar Photovoltaic Generating Facility in the City of Cambridge, Maryland (the “Application”). After review of the Application, the Commission docketed the matter as Case No. 9434. The Application is available on the Commission’s website under the appropriate case jacket.

The Applicant is proposing to construct a 45.90 MW alternating current solar photovoltaic facility on an approximately 320-acre portion of a property in the City of Cambridge (the “Site”). Approximately 120-150 design, management, and construction personnel will work (remotely or on site) on the Project at the height of construction, which is anticipated to be complete in December 2018.

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

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
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
