Dear Mr. Sampson:

On August 4, 2016, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submitted for filing an Engineering and Procurement Agreement (E&P Agreement) with RE Mustang Two LLC. Waiver of the Commission's notice requirements pursuant to section 35.11 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 35.11) is granted,¹ and the E&P Agreement is accepted for filing, effective August 5, 2016, as requested.

This filing was noticed on August 4, 2016, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before August 25, 2016. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action is taken pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation - West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
