BY THE COMMISSION: On September 18, 2014, the Commission issued an order granting a certificate of public convenience and necessity and accepting the registration statement for Innovative Solar 46, LLC (Applicant), for construction of an 80-MW_{AC} solar photovoltaic electric generating facility to be located at 1000 Roslin Farm Road, Hope Mills, Cumberland County, North Carolina.

On September 9, 2015, Entropy Investment Management, LLC filed a letter with the Commission stating that it had purchased the Applicant and the facility.

On October 2, 2015, the Applicant filed an amendment to its application stating that the facility will encompass additional acreage besides that identified in its initial application. The physical address of the Facility included in the initial application remained the same, and no other information included in the application changed.

On October 8, 2015, the Commission issued an Order Requiring Further Review by State Clearinghouse.

On October 16, 2015, the Applicant requested permission to construct perimeter fencing, erosion control measures, pile installation, equipment pads and underground wiring on the additional acreage identified in the October 2, 2015, amendment to the application.

On October 20, 2015, the Commission issued an Order Allowing Limited Construction with Conditions, allowing the Applicant to begin certain construction activities on the additional acreage identified in the October 2, 2015, amendment to the application with certain conditions.

On November 16, 2015, the State Clearinghouse filed comments. Because of the nature of the comments, the cover letter indicated that no further State Clearinghouse review action by the Commission was required for compliance with the North Carolina Environmental Policy Act.

The Public Staff presented this matter to the Commission at its Regular Staff Conference on November 30, 2015. The Public Staff stated that it had reviewed the amendment and determined it to be in compliance with the requirements of G.S. 62-110.1(a) and Commission Rule R8-64.

Based upon the foregoing, and the recommendation of the Public Staff, the Commission finds good cause to approve the amended application and issue the requested certificate.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That the application filed by Innovative Solar 46, LLC, for an amended certificate of public convenience and necessity shall be, and is hereby, approved.

2. That Appendix A shall constitute the amended certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Innovative Solar 46, LLC, for the 80-MW_{AC} solar photovoltaic electric generating facility to be located at 1000 Roslin Farm Road, Hope Mills, Cumberland County, North Carolina.
