BY THE COMMISSION: On June 3, 2014, Carolina Solar Energy II, LLC (Carolina Solar), filed an application pursuant to Commission Rule R8-64(b) seeking a certificate of public convenience and necessity pursuant to G.S. 62-110.1 for construction of a 4.99-MW_{AC} solar photovoltaic electric generating facility to be located in Northampton County, North Carolina. The application stated that Carolina Solar plans to sell the electricity generated by the facility to Dominion North Carolina Power (DNCP).

On June 5, 2014, Carolina Solar filed a registration statement for a new renewable energy facility. The registration statement included the certified attestations required by Commission Rule R8-66(b).

Also on June 5, 2014, the Commission issued an Order Requiring Publication of Notice.

On July 15, 2014, the State Clearinghouse filed comments. Because of the nature of the comments, the cover letter indicated that no further State Clearinghouse review action by the Commission was required for compliance with the North Carolina Environmental Policy Act.

On July 24, 2014, Carolina Solar filed a certificate of service stating that a copy of the application and the related public notice were provided to DNCP on July 22, 2014.

On September 12, 2014, Carolina Solar filed an affidavit of publication from Roanoke-Chowan News-Herald (Ahoskie, NC) stating that the publication of notice was completed on August 19, 2014. No complaints have been received.

On September 23, 2014, Carolina Solar and Peanut Market Farm Solar, LLC, filed in Docket Nos. SP-2363, Sub 10, and SP-4342, Sub 0, an amendment to the application and registration statement to provide that the Applicant, a wholly owned subsidiary of Carolina Solar, would own the proposed facility and should receive the certificate of public convenience and necessity.

The Public Staff presented this matter to the Commission at its Regular Staff Conference on November 10, 2014. The Public Staff stated that it had reviewed the application and determined it to be in compliance with the requirements of G.S. 62-110.1(a) and Commission Rule R8-64. The Public Staff further stated that the registration statement contains the certified attestations required by Commission Rule R8-66(b). Therefore, the Public Staff recommended approval of the certificate and registration for the facility.

After careful consideration, the Commission finds good cause to approve the application and issue the attached certificate for the proposed solar photovoltaic electric generating facility. The Commission further finds good cause, based upon the foregoing and the entire record in this proceeding, to accept registration of the facility as a new renewable energy facility. Peanut Market Farm Solar, LLC, shall annually file the information required by Commission Rule R8-66 on or before April 1 of each year and will be required to participate in the NC-RETS renewable energy certificate (REC) tracking system (<http://www.ncrets.org>) in order to facilitate the issuance of RECs.


IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That the application of Peanut Market Farm Solar, LLC, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity shall be, and is hereby, approved.
2. That Appendix A shall constitute the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Peanut Market Farm Solar, LLC, for the 4.99-MW_{AC} solar photovoltaic electric generating facility located in Northampton County at Peanut Market Road, adjacent to the Dominion North Carolina Power Seaboard substation near the town of Seaboard, North Carolina.
3. That the registration statement filed by Peanut Market Farm Solar, LLC, for its solar photovoltaic facility located in Northampton County, North Carolina, as a new renewable energy facility shall be, and is hereby, accepted.
4. That Peanut Market Farm Solar, LLC, annually file the information required by Commission Rule R8-66 on or before April 1 of each year.
5. That the Chief Clerk shall close Docket No. SP-2363, Sub 10.


