Shell Canada Limited (Shell), by Application No. 1271307 registered on May 31, 2002, applied to the Alberta Energy and Utilities Board (EUB) for approval to construct and operate a 160-MW cogeneration power plant in the Fort McMurray area. On February 19, 2004, the EUB approved the application and issued Approval No. U2004-038, which stipulated that the completion date for the power plant was to be on or before December 31, 2010. As of January 1, 2009, power plant Approval No. U2004-038 became an Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC or the Commission) matter.

Shell, by Application No. 1606776 registered on November 24, 2010, applied to the Commission for a time extension to complete the power plant. On December 13, 2010, the Commission approved the application and issued Approval No. U2010-419, which stipulated that the completion date for the power plant was to be on or before December 31, 2012.

Shell, by Application No. 1608289 (the Application), registered on March 27, 2012, applied to the Alberta Utilities Commission for an additional extension of time to complete the power plant.

Pursuant to Section 19 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, the Commission approved the Application in Decision 2012-106<sup>1</sup>, and pursuant to Section 11 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, granted this approval to Shell, to construct and operate the power plant, subject to the provisions of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act* and the *Alberta Utilities Commission Act*, any regulations made under the acts, any orders made under the acts, the Commission rules made pursuant to the *Alberta Utilities Commission Act*, and the following terms and conditions:

1. The power plant shall be located in the southeast quarter of Section 10, Township 95, Range 9, west of the Fourth Meridian, as further described in the application.
2. The power plant shall consist of a single 160-MW natural gas combustion turbine and generator set and heat recovery steam generator as further described in Application No. 1271307.

3. Unless otherwise authorized by the Commission, construction of the power plant shall be completed by December 31, 2015.
4. Shell shall notify the Commission within 30 days of completing the power plant.
5. Shell shall obtain Commission approval prior to making any substantive changes to the power plant or substantially varying the design or specifications of the power plant from what was stated in the application or what the Commission has approved.
6. This approval is not transferable unless approved by the Commission.

Approval No. U2010-419 is rescinded.

The Commission may cancel or suspend this approval, in whole or in part, in accordance with Section 41 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, or may review this approval, in whole or in part upon its own motion, or upon an application by an interested party, in accordance with Section 10 of the *Alberta Utilities Commission Act*.

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
