ENGLEWOOD, Colo.--(BUSINESS WIRE)--Westmoreland Coal Company (NasdaqGM:WLB) today announced that its Westmoreland Kemmerer, Inc. subsidiary entered into a six-year collective bargaining agreement with the represented employees at its Kemmerer Mine located in Lincoln County, Wyoming.
